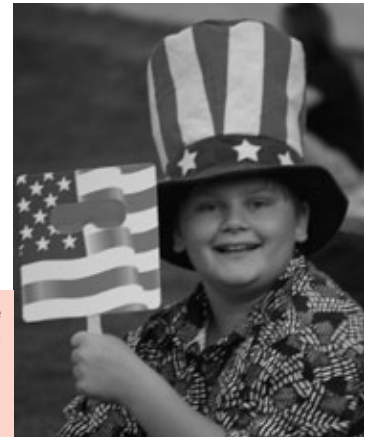
Annual Fourth of July Celebration

City Green Lights Summer Road Construction

This summer, the City of Auburn Public Works Department is working on a number of projects to improve roadways and traffic flow in Auburn. Whenever possible, major construction projects are strategically scheduled in the window between Auburn University's spring commencement and fall football traffic. Current and upcoming construction projects include:

West Glenn Avenue: Construction on West Glenn Avenue began on May 21st and is expected to continue until August 31st as crews widen the road to three lanes from North Donahue Drive to Wright Street to improve downtown traffic flow.

Hamilton Road: One of the City's most-requested resurfacing projects has been Hamilton Road which will be resurfaced from Moore's Mill Road eastward to the City limits beginning in June. Hamilton road will be widened by 4 feet on each side to include a bicycle lane for most of that distance, and a left turn lane will be added at the intersection of Hamilton Road and Bent Creek Road.

Cary Woods: The latest Safe Routes to School sidewalk project began on May 29th with crews installing new sidewalks near the Cary Woods Elementary School. The intent of the Federally funded Safe Routes to School program is to provide sidewalks in areas surrounding elementary schools in an effort to improve safety for children.

I-85: The State of Alabama will continue work on Auburn's new I-85 interchange, near Auburn Technology Park West. The new interchange will help improve accessibility to local technology parks and relieve Auburn's game-day traffic. In addition to the new exit, the Alabama Department of Transportation (ALDOT) will install steel cable in the median of I-85 to keep vehicles from crossing into oncoming traffic. Local I-85 construction is scheduled to be complete by December of this year.

Shug Jordan Parkway: ALDOT is currently resurfacing Shug Jordan Parkway in Auburn.

As construction crews work to finish each project in a timely manner, drivers are advised to use extreme caution while driving in construction zones and take alternate routes to avoid traffic delays. Auburn Named Bicycle Friendly Community

The League of American Bicyclists has named Auburn a Bronze Level Bicycle Friendly Community (BFC). This award recognizes Auburn's commitment to improving conditions for bicycling through an investment in bicycling promotion, education programs, infrastructure and pro-bicycling policies.

Auburn is the only municipality in Alabama to be named a Bicycle Friendly Community. The BFC program urges communities to evaluate their quality of life, sustainability and transportation networks, while allowing them to benchmark their progress toward improving their bicycle-friendliness. Auburn is one out of 214 BFC designated cities in 47 states across the nation.

"We are not surprised that this was the largest number of new and renewing applicants that we've ever had," said League President Andy Clarke. "The popularity of this program is clear evidence that investment in bicycling is a major catalyst in creating the kind of vibrant communities people want to live, work and visit. Auburn recognizes that simple steps to make bicycling safe and comfortable pay huge dividends in civic, community and economic development."

The BFC program provides a roadmap to building a Bicycle Friendly Community. Since its inception, more than 500 distinct communities have applied and the four levels of the award – platinum, gold, silver and bronze – provide a clear incentive for communities to continuously improve.

The League of American Bicyclists promotes bicycling for fun, fitness and transportation, and works through advocacy and education for a bicycle-friendly America. Renew Opelika Road Public Meetings, June 27-29

From the Auburn 2020 plan in the 1990s to the recent CompPlan 2030, public input has been a hallmark of the City's efforts to plan for the future. During the CompPlan 2030 process, the Opelika Road area was identified as one of the City's most important commercial corridors, and as a prime candidate for reinvestment.

The City of Auburn will be looking to you again for input on a plan to Renew Opelika Road. This will be the first of several opportunities for public input during this planning process.

The final outcome of Renew Opelika Road will be a plan to guide the future development of Opelika Road and help ensure the area's commercial viability. The plan will help answer questions of how the community and City can support Auburn's existing businesses and attract new destinations for residents. The plan will also reflect the most effective way to improve traffic flow, pedestrian accessibility and the overall look and feel that citizens envision for the Auburn community.

Building the Future Through the Past, Brick by Brick...

Honor the military service of a friend or loved one by etching their memory in stone through the City's Veterans Memorial Park Brick Program. For a \$100 tax-free, tax-deductible contribution per brick, you can help honor the men and women who have served preserving America's freedom.

The park, located at the corner of Ross Street and Glenn Avenue, is the site of the City's Annual Memorial Day Celebration. The featured element of the memorial is a 15-foot high obelisk, positioned centrally in the park, surrounded by brick pavers bearing the names of Veterans with connections to Auburn.

Each brick you order will be engraved to your specifications. The brick will include the name, rank, branch of service, and the dates of the years served by the Veteran. Bricks may be personalized up to four lines per brick, with up to 14 characters per line. In addition, two lines are permitted for Veterans with longer names.

To order your bricks, please fill out an online form and return it along with a \$100 check made payable to the Veterans Memorial Fund. You may send checks to Auburn City Hall, 144 Tichenor Avenue, Suite 2, Auburn, AL 36830. To ensure timely processing of your order, please notify City Hall at (334) 501-7270 once your form has been mailed.

Once your brick has been placed at the monument, it will also be viewable online at www.auburnalabama.org/veterans by clicking on the brick archive tab located on the left side of the page.

Last year, 19 new memorial blocks were added to the 800 plus bricks honoring individual veterans at the Auburn Veterans Memorial Monument.

Water Conservation Tips for Auburn Residents

Due to persistent drought conditions and warm summer temperatures, water demands are currently above normal for this time of year. The current drought began 2 years ago in July 2010 and the Auburn area is currently in an extreme drought. The Water Works Board of the City of Auburn (Water Board) has an ample supply of water to meet domestic demands and to provide fire protection. The Water Board reminds customers to water efficiently during this time of year to minimize water demands and water costs. The following are some easy water conservation tips.

- Water early in the morning or late in the evening, not during the heat of the day. Watering between 8:00 p.m. and 8:00 a.m. is recommended. Check your sprinkler system timer and make adjustments as needed.
- Check sprinkler heads and adjust them as needed to keep water on your lawn, trees and shrubs and to keep water off of the street, driveway and sidewalk.
- Check your sprinkler system for leaks and make repairs in a timely manner to minimize water losses and to minimize irrigation costs.
- Do not leave manual sprinklers or running hoses unattended. If watering manually, use a timer to remind you to turn off the water. An unattended water hose can waste approximately 10 to 25 gallons of water per minute.
- Take shorter showers.
- Do not let the water run while brushing your teeth, washing your face or washing dishes by hand.
- Only run full loads of laundry and dishes.

The American Water Works Association defines water conservation as doing more with less, not doing without. By working together we can preserve our water supply, save money and efficiently use our water resources. 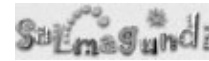
